"Silent Night" is probably one of my favorite Christmas carols. Perhaps because since my childhood I cannot recollect a Christmas Eve when I did not sing it in a beautifully decorated church sanctuary, surrounded by loved ones, candlelight and the feeling of God's presence in the air.

What is it about silence that is so powerful? Silence is either peaceful or painful. And, depending upon our circumstances, the place we find ourselves, we may try to avoid silence at all costs. It can seem so difficult to come face to face, for example, with things within us that we don't like about ourselves – the sin that so easily entangles us, or with the circumstances we may find ourselves

in – strained relationships, loss, grief, or our perceived failures. Silence does not always seem golden. But, perhaps when we find it the most difficult thing to do, being silent is precisely what we need to do most.

This time of year can get really crazy, but I highly encourage you to stop for at least 10 minutes a day, in silence – just you and the Lord. Just breathe, sit, and listen to the stillness, to the silence. And, in it, you may meet with God in a very precious way, feeling his love for you, experiencing God's joy in you and receiving God's peace that is always there for you, no matter what you may be facing.

As you prepare for the celebration for the coming King – baby Jesus, allow God's Holy Spirit to minister to you, and to prepare you to be an extension of Christ's love to those around you.






Sermon Series for Advent: "Not a Silent Night" by **Adam Hamilton**
