A Note From Pastor Marianne

"My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends" (Jesus, John 15:12-13, *NIV*).

In ancient Rome, February 14 was a pagan holiday to honor Juno, the goddess of women and marriage and the queen of the Roman Gods and goddesses.

Later, however, it became a Christian holiday named after a Christian priest. According to church tradition St. Valentine was a priest near Rome about the year 270 A.D. At that time the Roman Emperor imprisoned Christians for not worshipping the Roman gods. During this persecution Valentine was arrested because of the stand he took, refusing to do so.

While he was in prison, Valentine did not stop ministering to and witnessing to his fellow prisoners and even to the guards. The story goes that one of the guards, who was a good man, had adopted a blind girl. He asked Valentine if his God could help his daughter. Valentine prayed and the girl received her sight. The guard and his whole family, 46 people, believed in Jesus and were baptized. When the emperor heard about this, he was furious that Valentine was still making converts even in prison, so he had Valentine killed.

St. Valentine was willing to risk his life to share the good news of God's love through Christ Jesus.

According to high school teacher, Bob Mc Ilhenny, Valentine and the prisoner's daughter that had been blind developed a special friendship. Before he was executed, Valentine wrote her a note of encouragement and signed it "Your Valentine." Out of this sad scenario came the celebration of what we now call Valentine's Day. A special day for expressing love and friendship.

Jesus said, "Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends." This is what Valentine did. He loved and cared enough for his community, including his "enemies," that he risked his life and lost his life, so that others would have the opportunity to know Christ.

Jesus did this for all the world – and "while we were still sinners Jesus died for us."

On Valentine's Day and on every day, let us be risk takers and be quick to express God's love through our love to those around us – friend and foe alike. And let's not forget to also express our love to Jesus, who showed us the way to God's love, who

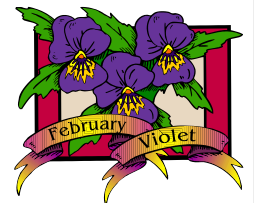

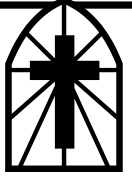

Parenting Study to Begin in March 2013

Willow UMC will be offering a free parenting study for parents of children of all ages. The study time will be utilizing a parenting series by Jim Williams who is a national parenting advocate and speaker and the director of Parent Education and Asset Development for STARS, a school based program helping students make healthy lifestyle choices.

This study will begin with "Parenting 101: The Basics of Becoming a Proactive Parent." This is a 4 week study with the following titles: "Navigating Through Troubled Waters," "Developing a Parenting Plan," "Managing the 'Balancing Act,'" and "Keeping Your Family Strong."

"This Proactive Parenting series is about choosing to live in a circle of influence with God in the center. It's about learning how to parent with a plan so that you can become the kind of parent that God wants you to be."

The class will be meeting on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month from 11:00am to 12:00pm in the home of Tyler and Jennifer Johnson, who live about 2 minutes from the Willow UMC at 25305 Bernadine Rd, New Boston. Jeanne Lochner, Children's Ministry Director, will provide a Children's teaching time during the parenting study which will also be held at the Johnson's home.

Our first class will begin on March 10. The format includes opening prayer, introductions, 15 minutes DVD teaching by the author, Jim Williams, and group discussion time.

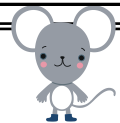
Meeting opened at 10:55 a.m. with prayer by Pastor Marianne.

- ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD:** December Minutes were read. Mark B. motioned to accept the minutes as read. R. P. supported. Motion Carried.
