A note from Pastor Brad:

An uncomfortable issue challenges our wellbeing today. In the midst of a world that seems filled with more tension, stress, frustration and uncertainty many individuals are finding themselves addicted to destructive behaviors. In fact, the latest statistics indicate that approximately 1 out of every 8 Americans is living with some sort addiction. Addiction to drugs and/or alcohol is a problem for approximately 30 million people in the United

States alone.

Our culture, including Christians, is addicted. The top ten addictions today are: Alcohol, smoking, drugs, gambling, food addiction, video games, internet addiction, sex addiction, shopping, and work addiction. The list of addictive behaviors has never been longer. Yet, there is hope!

In Malachi 3:6 God says to the people who were hooked on the ways of the world and not on God's way, "I the Lord do not change."

If you have ever owned a piano, you know that it gets out of tune as time passes. Some notes go sharp, some flat. When a piano tuner tunes a piano he or she will often use a tuning fork. For example, a piano tuner will tap a middle C tuning fork on a hard surface and compare its sound to that of the piano's middle C. The tuner then adjusts the piano's string as needed to bring it in pitch with the tuning fork. The piano tuner knows the tone of the tuning fork will stay constant. It was middle C yesterday; it will be middle C tomorrow; it will be middle C a thousand years from now.

You and I need a middle C. Haven't you had enough stress, enough questions about changes in your health, finances, work, relationships and more? In the midst of all those changes and challenges it is easy to get trapped in destructive behaviors that seem to offer relief. At best, the relief is only temporary. God who ruled the earth last night is the same God who rules it today. Same convictions – God's love for you, God's willingness to help you will never end. Same plan – to do good for you as it says in Jeremiah 29:11, "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

May the living God of hope fill you with joy and peace as you trust in him.



AA Ministry: Utilize a 12 step program to help those suffering the effects of alcohol addiction. Meetings are held at the church Wednesdays at 6:00 pm


Music Ministry: Choir and worship opportunities through music participation. Practice every Wednesday at 7:00 pm.



ATTENDANCE: Jan Holland, Pastor Brad Lewis, Katherine Buck, Donna Lee Hornyak, Helena & R.P.

Lilly, Jim & Kathy Farr, Mark Buttignoli, Linda Kemp, and John Tarr.

ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD: February Ad Board minutes were read. Jim motioned to accept. Mark supported.

Motion carried.

PASTORS REPORT: Pastor Brad reported that there was a request to add two more people allowed to carry a

concealed pistol in church. R. P. motioned that an increase from one specific person (1) to a total of three (3) specific persons be allowed. Mark supported. Motion carried. Pastor Brad is developing a worship team. He enjoyed the chicken supper, but does have some concerns regarding proper health procedures. He will meet with Julie. He would like to discuss the possibility of having an additional TV monitor on the other

side of the church. He also would like an usher committee.

PASTOR PARISH: Donna Lee reported that the Pastor Parish Committee met for an evaluation of the

BUDGET: 2016 Budget is falling behind \$1,345.24.

church for her baby shower. A women's meeting is scheduled, so approval is postponed. A wedding is to be held at the church on July 9, 2016 for a non-member church

couple.
