A NOTE FROM PASTOR BRAD:

Perhaps you are like me. You have, at some point in your life, worked hard to achieve a life of "success," and now you find it empty. So you begin looking for something else. Your search takes you down several roads and pathways, but nothing has yet offered any greater "success" than you already have. Maybe you are trying to reach the wrong destination in your life. Maybe you should consider a life of "significance" instead of "success."

In the Book of Acts the apostle Peter describes Jesus' earthly ministry this way, "God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power, and... he went around doing good and healing all who were under the power of the devil, because God was with him [Acts 10:38].

Notice that Peter simply describes Jesus as "doing good." I am certain there are more descriptive words to define what Jesus did, but according to Peter "doing good" was good enough. Arguably the good Jesus did can be sighted as changing the course of human history. That is significant!

Too often "success" in this world doesn't hold much lasting value, but a life of "significance" can change the course of history. So if you are looking for something that fills your emptiness try "doing good." From personal experience I can affirm that it is in going around "doing good" that I found something much better than "success." I found "significance." You see, going around "doing good" leads to the road that allows your life to be filled with Christ's power and purpose.

May God's goodness fill your life as you seek to "do good" in Jesus' name.

God Works is non-denominational and currently includes representatives from dozens of churches and secular groups and continues to welcome new members. Everyone in the God Works group believes that hungry people deserve to eat. Willow Church serves a free God Works Community Meal the 4th Thursday of each month from 6:00 pm to 6:30 p.m.

When our choir gave such a beautiful Easter Cantata?


