

A Note from Pastor Marianne

A Report on Course of Study



For quite a few years, now, the Willow UMC has had Local Pastors appointed by the Bishop and Cabinet of the Detroit Annual Conference. A Local Pastor is different from an Elder in the UMC, who is ordained after completing a Masters degree from a seminary and completing the probationary and ordination processes.

I am a Local Pastor, and I am required to continue in a Course of Study at an approved United Methodist Seminary, while serving in a ministry setting. I have been attending Garrett Evangelical Theological Seminary in Chicago, IL these past 3 summers for 10 days each year. Prior to going to Garrett for 2 classes each year, I am engaged in studying and paper writing which is due in June of each year. This has been such a wonderful, though I have to admit at times, stressful, experience. This year I completed courses in Spiritual Formation and Hebrew Bible I. I have found my classes to be informational, practical, challenging and spiritually renewing. I believe that my studies not only inform me, but transform me as well. My hope is that the growth and transformation I experience will make me better equipped to be the best pastor I can be.

The Course of Study this year really brought it home, to me, that personal study as well as study in community is so very important for our spiritual growth. I experienced that once again in my classes with fellow Local Pastors. My challenge and encouragement to you is, if you are not already studying the scriptures with some consistency, to determine to do just that. And, to join a Christian study of some kind – at least try out a short term one. At Willow we offer a Christian Parenting Study. (Please read the article in this newsletter). In the Fall we will begin a weekly Bible Study – no prior Biblical knowledge needed – just an open heart and desire to learn together. Periodically throughout the church year, seasonal short term studies will be offered on Sunday mornings – consider these when the invitation is made. I'm not saying that you can't learn and grow on your own, it's just that when we come together in community to focus on the scriptures, something different happens. Often new insights and encouragement is gained by listening to one another's thoughts and experiences.

The Apostle Paul in Romans 12:2 encourages us to "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God – what is good and acceptable and perfect." Studying the scriptures alone and in a group help us on our journey with God.

Pastor Taek Kim (pronounced "tech") entered into ministry in 1992. He has been in previous ministry settings working with youth in Washington, D.C.; Baltimore, MD; Arlington, VA; and other churches in Flint, Birmingham, Walled Lake (2004-2012).

Originally from Seoul, Korea, he was raised in Waterford, Michigan. His early spiritual formation took place in the Korean United Methodist Church in Troy, Ml. He began his undergraduate studies at GMI Engineering & Management Institute and then transferred to Wayne State University, graduating with a BA in Speech Communication to begin preparations for full-time ministry. Post Graduate experiences include Clinical Pastoral Education at the Washington Hospital Center in Washington, D.C. and receiving a Masters of Divinity from Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, DC.

Pastor Taek was ordained as an elder in 2005. He and his wife Jamie were married on July 6, 2002. And they are joyful parents of daughter Rebekah and twin sons Andrew and Jonathan.
